The cocoa production is a risky business. Cocoa farmers and their families may suffer from health issues, poor harvests, theft, for which they are not insured. Companies and NGOs that have invested in sustainability programs and cooperatives worry about farmers' high turn-over rates. In this break-out we will dive deeper into evidence that shows how financial mechanisms can reduce risks in the supply chain both for cocoa producers and for buyers.
